VISIT TO PIANEZZA AND COSENZA

I currently serve as a Commissioner with the Lansing Regional Sister City Commission, Sub-Committee on Italy. Last month, I was honored to be in the role of ambassador to represent the City of Lansing, in the sister city of Pianezza, near Torino, and Friendship city of Cosenza. I was accompanied by a couple of other commissioners to form a Lansing delegation.

During our visit, we were able to meet some very influential individuals which included the President of Region of Piomonte; representatives from of the Commercial Council of Piomonte; representatives from the Industrial Union; representatives from the Torino Airport; representative from the manufacturing association, and many other business owners. Legend of the "La Befana"

On January 6th. of each year in Italy, they celebrate "La Befania". It is a traditional holiday story that young and old still presently believe in, just like Santa Claus. The story has it that La Befana (a good old witch) delivers presents during the middle of the night. She delivers these presents to those children who have been good throughout the year.

This holiday marks the end of the Christmas season and the day that the three Wise Man arrived at the manger of the Christ child. Over the years the Epiphany has been a more celebrated holiday for the children of Italy than even Christmas.

As the legend has it the Three Wise Men were in search of the Christ child when they decided to stop at a small house to ask directions. When they knocked on the door, an old woman holding a broom opened the door.

She saw three colorfully dressed Wise Men who were looking for the Christ child at her doorsteps. The old woman did not know who these three strange men were and was unable to point them in the right direction.

The three Wise Men asked the old woman to join in the journey of looking for the Christ child, and she declined because she had too much housework to be done. After the three men had left, the old woman felt that she had made a mistake of not joining the search and decided to catch up with the three Wise Men.

After many hours of searching, she was not able to find the three Wise Men. The old woman felt that she missed a special opportunity to see the Christ child, so she proceeded to stop every child to give them a small treat with the hopes that one of the children would be the Christ child.





ITALIAN LANGUAGE CLASSES IN LANSING SCHOOLS?

As you might have seen recently on the program on WILX-10 about the NOI Foundation teaches children in Michigan about Italian language and culture. IAC of Lansing's President Tony De Luca is working with NOI's Executive Director, Raffaella Naurato, to bring Italian language classes to some schools in the Lansing area.

Here is some additional information about NOI. The N.O.I. (Nuovi Orizzonti Italiani or New Italian Horizons) is a Michigan non-profit educational corporation with tax-exempt status under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code devoted to promoting the teaching of the Italian Language and Culture through the Consulate of Italy in Detroit.

The objective of the N.O.I. Foundation is to allow as many students as possible to study and learn the Italian language and Culture. To achieve this goal, the N.O.I. Foundation is prepared to assist public and private schools interested in our program by providing educational materials, books, videos, manipulatives, and, if necessary, some financial support.

So, if you know of any high school student that might be interested in learning the Italian language, please encourage them to sign-up for the course when it is presented. Of course, the Italian language class will only be offered if thre is enough intersect.

Also, through the Lansing Regional Sister City Commission there will be some upcoming opportunities for an high school students exchange program with Sister City of Pianezza and possibly Cosenza. If a student already knows a little of he Italian language, that will make their experience of the exchange even more exciting. Stay tune for more information on the schools and start of classes, as it becomes available.

Italian Christmas Traditions

Italian Christmas traditions include celebrating from December 8th to January 6th, featuring customs like the Nativity scene, La Befana delivering gifts on Epiphany, and a meat-free Christmas Eve dinner focused on seafood. Families often gather for festive meals, enjoy Christmas markets, and participate in local folklore and music, such as the zampognari playing bagpipes.

Overview of Italian Christmas Traditions

Christmas in Italy is celebrated from December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, to January 6th, the Epiphany. This festive season is rich with unique customs, food, and family gatherings.

KEY TRADITIONS

NATIVITY SCENES

- PRESEPE: The tradition of creating nativity scenes, or "presepi," is particularly strong in Naples, where artisans craft detailed figures representing village life.
- LIVING NATIVITIES: IN SOUTHERN ITALY, COMMUNITIES REENACT THE NATIVITY SCENE, BRINGING THE STORY
 TO LIFE WITH ACTORS AND ANIMALS.

LA BEFANA

• **GIFT-GIVING**: ON THE NIGHT BEFORE THE EPIPHANY (JANUARY 5TH), LA BEFANA, A KIND OLD WITCH, DELIVERS GIFTS TO CHILDREN. GOOD CHILDREN RECEIVE SWEETS, WHILE NAUGHTY ONES MAY FIND COAL.

CHRISTMAS EVE FEAST

LA VIGILIA: ITALIANS TRADITIONALLY ENJOY A MEAT-FREE MEAL ON CHRISTMAS EVE, OFTEN FEATURING
MULTIPLE SEAFOOD DISHES. THIS PRACTICE IS ROOTED IN CATHOLIC CUSTOMS OF PURIFICATION BEFORE
CHRISTMAS.

CHRISTMAS MARKETS

 MERCATINI DI NATALE: OUTDOOR CHRISTMAS MARKETS ARE POPULAR, OFFERING LOCAL CRAFTS, FOOD, AND FESTIVE TREATS LIKE ROASTED CHESTNUTS AND PANETTONE.

CELEBRATORY ACTIVITIES

MIDNIGHT MASS

MANY ITALIANS ATTEND MIDNIGHT MASS ON CHRISTMAS EVE, ESPECIALLY IN VATICAN CITY, WHERE THE POPE LEADS THE SERVICE.

MUSIC AND FESTIVITIES

ZAMPOGNARI: BAGPIPE PLAYERS, KNOWN AS ZAMPOGNARI, PERFORM IN PUBLIC SQUARES, CONTINUING A
TRADITION THAT DATES BACK TO ANCIENT TIMES.

DECORATIONS

• CHRISTMAS TREES: Trees are typically decorated on December 8th and remain up until the Epiphany.
